ON THE CULTIVATION OF ROSES.

Roses delight in a deep, rich soil, well manured and well drained. Plant in the autumn or early spring. Prune in February, before the sap begins to rise, cutting away the weak and crossing branches, that the heart of the bush may be open to the sun and air.

The Kitchen Garden should be laid out in beds, not more than four feet wide, with convenient paths between for the wheelbarrow. A constant succession may be had by sowing small quantities at intervals. Keep the ground clean and well stirred, and water in dry weather.

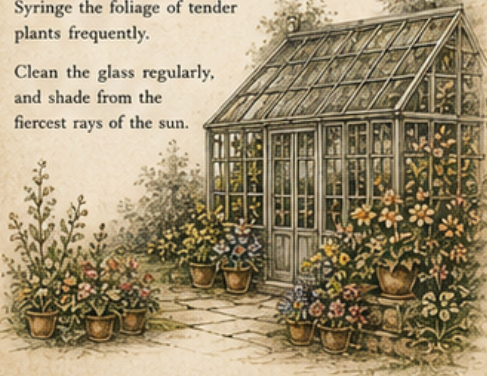

GREENHOUSE MANAGEMENT.

The House should be airy, yet free from draughts. In winter, keep the temperature as even as possible, and admit air on mild days. Water in the morning, that the leaves may be dry ere night. Syringe the foliage of tender plants frequently.

Clean the glass regularly, and shade from the fiercest rays of the sun.

Let the walks be winding and the beds irregular; nature loves variety, and so will we.

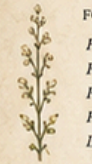

MARCH.

Sow Peas, Beans, and early Vegetables.
Pot Geraniums and tender plants.
Turn the compost.

APRIL.

Plant out hardy annuals.
Sow succession of lettuces.
Keep weeds down.

MAY.

Plant out tender annuals.
Sow late vegetables.
Attend to roses.
